
Museum of Pop

The museum was founded by Microsoft co-founder Paul Allen in the year of 2000 as EMP, but was later named MoPOP. There are multiple rooms in the building, which was designed to look like a smashed guitar. Each room has a specific subject: But there isn't just music. There is also a video game room, where the visitors are shown how computer and console games are made and there are samples of various games. Visitors also have the chance to see an exhibit about abstract fashion, the origin of the electric guitar and various special, temporary exhibits e.g. a Star Trek and a Nirvana display.
